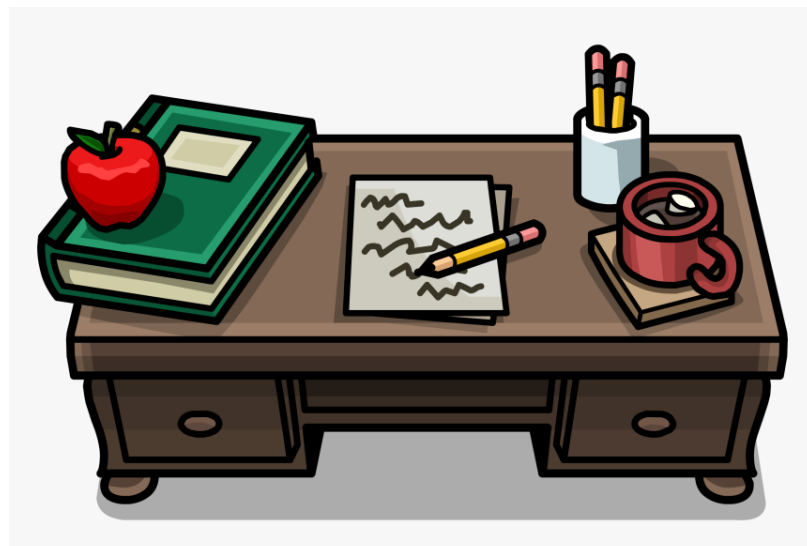

Special lunches and other activities will still be offered at different times throughout the year. Whilst we appreciate that this may be disappointing for your children, we are looking into options for external providers to provide canteen style lunches. We will be approaching local businesses in the near future to see what they may be able to offer. We will ensure that we keep you informed once a decision has been made.

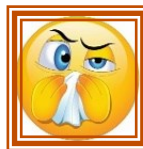

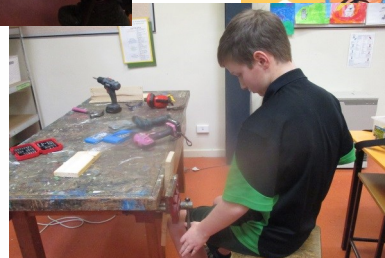
HANDS ON LEARNING

INDONESIAN NEWS

Dice aren't just for Maths! During Indonesian this fortnight we have used dice to play games such as One More, One Less and Biggest Number. Students in the 1/2 area are learning numbers to 20 and the rules that go along with climbing beyond 10. One More, One Less saw students using two 6 sided dice to roll a number, then they had to write in words the number they rolled. They also had to write the number one less and the number one more – all in Indonesian. The 1/2 students also got to complete a Numbers to 20 wordsearch and we had fun being tricked by finding the number Dua (2), but then finding it was actually Duabelas (12) or Duapuluh (20)! Prep students are having fun singing along to Number songs online, amongst other activities, and have even been able to count backwards from 10! Sepuluh Botol Hijau (Ten Green Bottles) has been one of their favourites to practise counting with. Indonesian numerals are written in the exact same way as English numerals, so learning to count in Indonesian also helps students learn number recognition and gives them another opportunity to practise writing the numerals themselves.

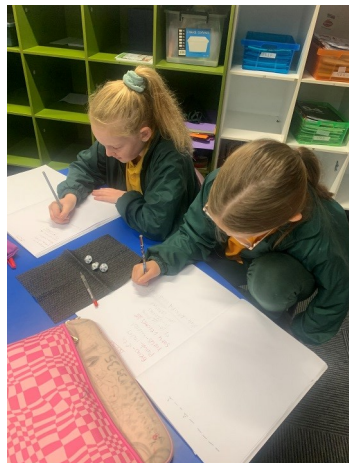
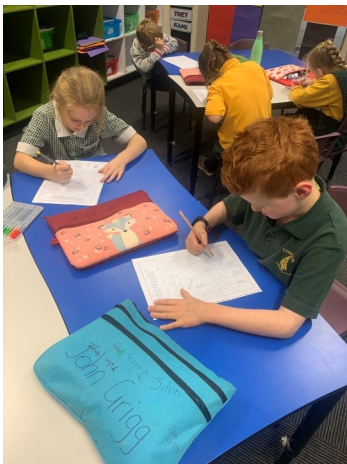
The senior unit have been playing Bingo with numbers up to 20 to switch on their Indonesian language learning brains. They have then been challenging themselves with three 10 sided dice and seeing who could make the biggest number, then writing it in Indonesian words. They played this game in pairs so the students could help each other remember the words for teen, 'ty' (or tens), and hundred. The person with the biggest

number won! Learning numbers in Indonesian is quite straight forward as it is the only time the English words can be directly substituted for the Indonesian ones. We write the number how we say it.

We hope you have enjoyed our snippet of the language learning occurring in the Indonesian classroom, more to come next week.

Hello, my name is **Jaclyn Hand**, I'm currently the Vice President of school council. I'm mum to William in grade four and Annabelle in grade two.


