# INDONESIAN NEWS

We have had a very busy start to the term in Indonesian! Across the year levels we are learning colours, questions and answers about feelings, name and age; and greetings for the different times of the day. To answer the roll this term, students are answering a multiple choice question in Indonesian. Our first question related to which fruit they prefer. I asked Kamu lebih suka buah apa? Apel, Stroberi, Jeruk atau Mangga? To which the students replied Saya lebih suka buah..... (insert preferred fruit here!). They are doing a fantastic job answering my questions so far, lots of students love Apel (apples) and Stroberi (strawberries). Not many students preferred Jeruk (oranges) or Mangga (mangoes).

In the Junior Unit students have just finished asking each other Apa Kabar? How are you? They can answer with three responses – Baik baik saja, Biasa saja and Kurang baik, meaning Good, OK, and not so good. We wrote these feelings on cards that we could use to react to some fantastic stories about a topsy turvy day that we also wrote in pairs.

We shared these with each other and had a laugh hearing about yummy breakfasts (Baik baik saja), annoying siblings (kurang baik) and plates of vegies for tea (biasa saja). It was fun to see all the different reactions to the topsy turvy days.




### **PARKING REMINDER**

# TERM 3 CRESWICK PRIMARY AFTER SCHOOL NETBALL




Another Term of After-School netball has started up on Wednesday nights at Ballarat Netball Association.


