Year 5 and 6

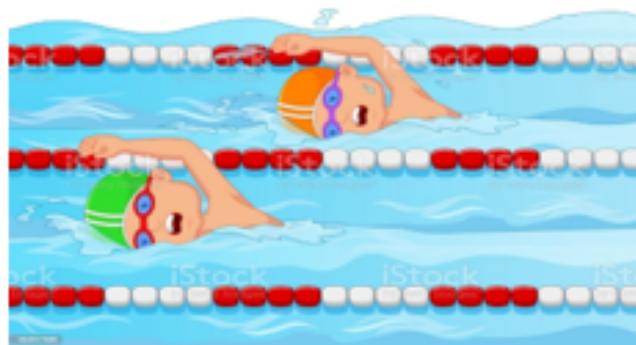

Grade 5/6 Economics

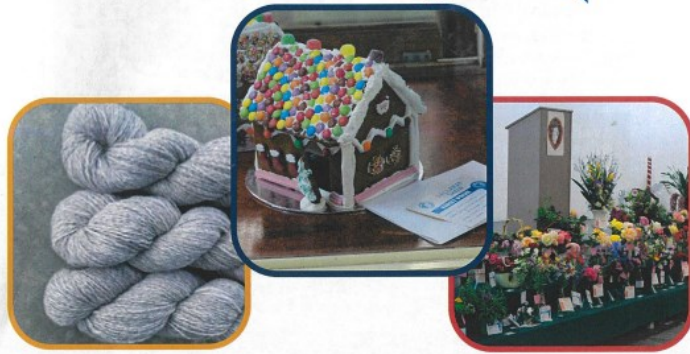

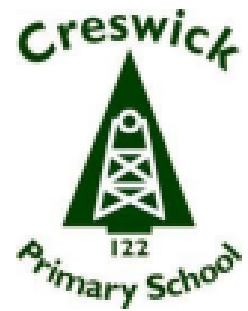

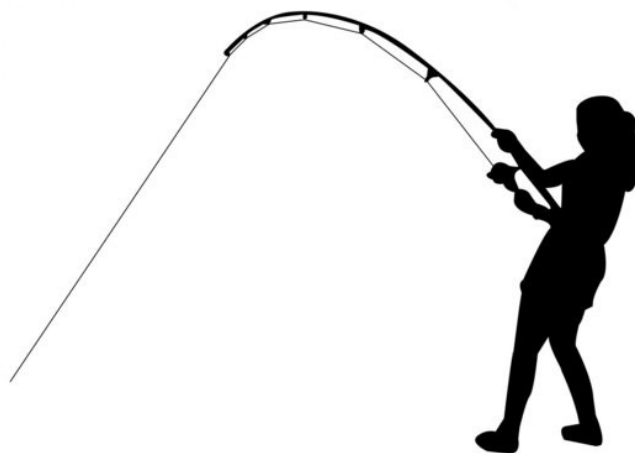
Victorian Fisheries Authority Initiative

The Victorian Fisheries Authority have created the 'Little Anglers Initiative' aimed at Grade 5 students across the state.

All Grade 5 students have been selected to receive a little anglers kit based on the Victorian Curriculum area of focus, movement and motor development, and safety considerations.

Year 5 students at Creswick Primary School will receive a kit that includes: a fishing rod, reel with line, tackle box with some hooks, sinkers, swivels and a lure, as well as a Kids Guide to Fishing – all FREE! For more information Victoria Fisheries have created a [kid-friendly web hub](#) with lots of useful information and videos.

Frequently Asked Questions - Parents

Q. What are Little Angler Kits?

A. Little Angler Kits are the perfect way for primary school aged children to try fishing. They include a rod, reel with Line, tackle box, some tackle (including hooks) and information on how to use them all.

Grade 5 primary school students and all students at specialist schools will be offered a free Little Angler Kit.

The Victorian Fisheries Authority (VFA) will deliver the kits to primary and specialist schools between 16 October and 4 December 2023, unless schools opt out of the program.

Q. What size are the kits and what do they contain?

A. Little Angler Kits include a fishing rod, tackle tray, some tackle and a kids guide to fishing. The kits are approximately 3 foot Long.

Please note that the tackle tray does include fishing hooks. The tackle tray will be wrapped in cardboard and placed inside a pocket, inside the kit bag, which will be cable tied to discourage students from opening their kits until they are under the supervision of a parent or carer. Teachers will also tell students not to open the kits until they are safely at home with a parent or carer.

Q. Are the kits safe?

A. Please note that the tackle tray does include fishing hooks. The tackle tray will be wrapped in cardboard and placed inside a pocket, inside the kit bag, which will be cable tied to discourage students from opening their kits until they are under the supervision of a parent or carer. Teachers will also tell students not to open the kits until they are safely at home with a parent or carer.

You can request for an adult to pick up the kit from the school by contacting the school.

If you do not wish your child to receive a kit for any reason, you can choose to opt out of receiving a Little Angler Kit.

The VFA will create a Little Angler hub on their website, which will be Live from 10 October 2023. It will contain useful information, instructional videos and online resources about where and how to fish. Check it out from 10 October 2023 at www.vfa.vic.gov.au/Littleanglerkit. Please refer to the information provided on how to use the kit safely with your child.

Q. Where do I Learn more about how to use the Little Angler Kit?

A. The VFA will create a Little Angler hub on their website, which will be Live from 10 October 2023. It will contain useful information, instructional videos and online resources about where and how to fish. Check it out from 10 October 2023 at www.vfa.vic.gov.au/Littleanglerkit.
