

















SWIMMING. TERM 4, 2023



This ring has been designed for learners and novice show riders. Riders are not eligible to enter any other rings on the day. Riders and horses entering this ring are not eligible for open events. Riding jackets are not compulsory. Neat casual dress is acceptable. EFA approved hard hats must be worn at all times and approved footwear to be worn. The pony or horse does not need to be plaited but should be neat and clean. Riders may be led.


