Curriculum Day - Berry Street Education Model - Body

Last Monday, our staff joined with 4 other schools to begin our work on the Berry Street Education Model. This model teaches staff how to approach education through the lens of a trauma approach. Last week we explored self-regulation strategies, de-escalation strategies, mindfulness strategies and ensuring that students are present, centred and ready to learn. Over the coming weeks, we will try some of the strategies we learnt before formalising our approach later in the year.


MOBILE PHONES


